Notes: Specific user scenarios were tested to ensure critical user paths were included in the VPAT. All application content was not tested, but rather a crucial sampling of content was used for test cases. Functions and critical user paths tested were: Home > Create a Project, Favorites, Edit a project; User Groups and Application settings; Select an already created project; Create a requirement and access a requirement after it was created to perform specific actions; Create a Test Case and Access an already created test case; Assign to requirement; Documents; Create a test set and link test sets from orchestrator; execute test sets; Test Results; and Project Settings.

Evaluation Methods Used: New Edition's Test Process for WCAG 2.1 AAA was used (based on Trusted Tester v5, WCAG 2.0 AAA, WCAG 2.1 A-AAA, and Section 508 Web testing). The following testing tools were used on a Windows 10 desktop: Accessibility Insights for Windows v1.1, Color Contrast Analyzer, NVDA v2020.4, external keyboard, 1.4.12 Text Spacing Bookmarklet, and ANDI.

Testing was performed by Trusted Testers from New Editions Consulting, Inc.
